Re: Parole Comments

Dear Madam/Sirs:

I am a 67 year old prisoner who has numerous medical issues; I've been to the Parole Board Eight times including the two times that I was postponed. And each time I was denied Parole and held for 24 months, except for my last Parole Interview in May-June 2015 where I was held for 18 months

Parole denials because of ones criminal history or nature of the crime should have no place in the decision to grant or deny Parole, when a prisoner is over 50 with a host of health issues he/she shouldn't be kept in prison past his/her minimum.

Prisoners shouldn't be forced to do decades past their minimum sentence. In the cases where prisoners were convicted and given a life sentence while under the age of 18, their minimum sentence should be the completion of their time and the life term.

In the cases where prisoners have completed all of their required programs they should be released on Parole - hold them will serve no purpose and cost the State.

Since my incarceration I have had countless operations and medical procedures, endured the loss of my mother, Father, wife, oldest sister, six uncles, Eight Aunts and a host of cousins. Had I been released on my very first Parole Interview I would have been home for my mother's funeral, my sister and some of my other relatives.
